


# Welcome to Year 3

## Homework

Here is the homework timetable:

To encourage independence school has provided every child with a reading diary which needs to be filled in each week. Children should bring these home every day and parents are asked to record the pages the child reads at home. Every time a child reads at home and records it in their reading diary they will receive a house point.

**All children have been provided with a book bag to help them remember reading books, reading diaries and homework. If parents would like to buy a new book bag these are available at the school office.**



# Hometime

All children in Year 3 need to be picked up from the red slide playground at the back of the school at 3:20pm

Classes will be lead into the playground by teachers and children need to wait with school staff until they are collected. Please make sure your child has told their teacher they have been collected before you take them home.

## PE

Please ensure that your child has the correct PE kit in school all week. If the weather is nice we may have additional sessions outside so a change of clothes is needed everyday just in case.

School provide all children with a PE T-shirt in their house colour, therefore all children need in their kit is a suitable pair of trainers/ pumps and shorts or tracksuit bottoms.

## **Attendance**

It is vital that your child attends school every day for them to reach their full potential. Children are expected to arrive in school at 8.40 am which is when they will read to an adult and complete comprehension tasks.



## **Behaviour**

We have high expectations of children in Key Stage 2 and this year we hope the standard will be even higher. The older children are given increasing responsibilities and are expected to act as role models for the younger children in school. We use a positive approach to behaviour where we praise and reward those who set a good example. We are firm and consistent when dealing with unacceptable behaviour



## **Out of School Activities**

We pride ourselves with the excellent range of extra-curricular activities the school provides. We hope that as many children as possible will take the opportunity to participate in the activities available throughout the year.

## **Multicultural Evening**

Multicultural evening this year will take place on Thursday 19th of October. This is an excellent opportunity for all the family to sample foods from different cultures. There will also be a firework display at the end of the evening.

## **Breakfast Club and After School Club**

The school has a breakfast club which runs every school day from 7.00am to 8.30am. This costs only £1.50 per week. After school club runs each day after school until 6:20pm. This costs £3 a day. Please ask a member of staff if you are interested.



## **House Points**

After another incredibly successful year, the house points system for all children will be continued. There are 4 houses – Lions, Tigers, Panthers and Jaguars and all the children and staff in school have been organised into one of these houses. Each child will be provided with a t-shirt in the colour of their house to be worn for all PE activities. House points will be awarded for a full week's attendance and for other things e.g. wearing school uniform every day, being helpful and for consistently working hard. Every Friday there will be a house assembly where the House Cup and the Attendance Cup will be awarded to the team with the most points. Results of each week's house assembly will be displayed on the corridor.



**Speech and Language Therapy** Our professional therapist will continue to undertake assessments and then provide a tailored programme for individuals and groups of children in Speech, Language and Communication. This programme will begin next week for some children.



### **Uniform**

It is vital that all children come to school in uniform and we really appreciate your help with this.

Additionally children must have appropriate PE kit which includes suitable footwear. Pumps are available from the school office. If children do not bring suitable footwear for PE then they will be provided with a pair of pumps and parents will be charged.

Other items of uniform including our new hooded jackets are available from the office.

**Please make sure all uniform is labelled with your child's name and class. This includes their P.E kit**

### **Parents Evening**

On Thursday the 12<sup>th</sup> of October there will be a Parents' Open Day. This is a great opportunity for you to meet and talk to your child's new teacher and discuss progress so far this year.
