Safeguarding

Holiday Scheme

After School Club and Holiday Scheme

Children must be toilet trained to access after school club and holiday scheme.

Dinner, ASC & Wraparound Money

All dinner, breakfast, after school club & wraparound money must be paid on a Monday morning in advance or children will not be allowed to stay. Please contact Mrs Busby on either Tuesday, Wednesday or Thursday if you have any issues with dinner, ASC or wraparound monies.

School dinners are free for children in classes 1,2,3,4,5,6,7,8,9 & 10. Nursery children pay for dinners unless you have been awarded free meals by Leeds City Council.

Dinners for Nursery & Classes 11,12,13,14,15,16,17,18,19,20 & 21 are £1.60 per Day or £8.00 a week.

School Bags

School bags are subsidised by school if you wish to purchase a new one:

Red book Bags for Reception & Year 1 are £5, Satchels for Year 2 to Year 6 are £8

Lockdown Procedures

During the next few weeks pupils and staff in St Bartholomew's will practise their lockdown procedures as part of our safeguarding procedures. A lockdown takes place if there is any occurrence happening outside of school which may harm the children eg a stray vicious dog coming onto the site or a leak of toxic waste etc. During a lockdown, we ensure that all the children are inside the building and that they are accounted for. They sit calmly in class and, if appropriate, continue with their learning. All external doors are locked to ensure that the school building is secure and if necessary, the emergency services are called. If the school were to have a lockdown we would contact you by text to advise that it was taking place and not to come to or call the school. This is because it may endanger yourselves or block our telephone lines to the services that we may need to help us. While this may all sound very serious, the need for a lockdown is extremely rare. We will continue to practice this procedure regularly so that we are ready should the need occur.
