### After School Club and Holiday Scheme

Children must be toilet trained to access after school club and holiday scheme.

### Dinner, ASC & Wraparound Money

All dinner, breakfast, after school club & wraparound money must be paid on a Monday morning in advance or children will not be allowed to stay. Please contact Mrs Busby on either Tuesday, Wednesday or Thursday if you have any issues with dinner, ASC or wraparound monies.

School dinners are free for children in classes 1,2,3,4,5,6,7,8,9 & 10. Nursery children pay for dinners unless you have been awarded free meals by Leeds City Council.

Dinners for Nursery & Classes 11,12,13,14,15,16,17,18,19,20 & 21 are £1.60 per Day or £8.00 a week.

### School Bags

School bags are subsidised by school if you wish to purchase a new one:

Red book Bags for Reception & Year 1 are £5, Satchels for Year 2 to Year 6 are £8
