Holiday Scheme Forms

Breakfast and Afterschool Club

Forms are now on the corridor and need to be signed in for the week or daily.

Monies Owing

To be able to attend Breakfast Club, Afterschool Club, Wraparound, School Dinners etc we ask that you pay on a Monday every week prior to using this service. Thank you.

Mobile Phones

All mobile phones must be handed into the office at the beginning of the day and be collected at the end of the day.

Polite Notice

Due to staffing and safeguarding issues children must be booked into After School Club BEFORE 1 O'clock. If you are unable to do this please make alternative arrangements for your child/children to be collected at 3.20pm, Thank you.

Late Picking up

We have an increasing number of children not being picked up on time at 3.20pm when school finishes. Children stay outside the front office until 3.30pm and then are taken into After School Club to sit and wait. There will be a charge of £5 for this service. If you think you might be late picking your child/children up please book them into After School Club for £3 before 1 O'clock.

Before and After School

Please ensure that your children DO NOT play on the apparatus. School will not take responsibility for any accidents occurring before and after school. Thank you.

After School Club and Holiday Scheme

Children must be toilet trained to access after school club and holiday scheme.

Dinner, ASC & Wraparound Money

All dinner, breakfast, after school club & wraparound money must be paid on a Monday morning in advance or children will not be allowed to stay. Please contact Mrs Busby on either Tuesday, Wednesday or Thursday if you have any issues with dinner, ASC or wraparound monies.

School dinners are free for children in classes 1,2,3,4,5,6,7,8,9 & 10. Nursery children pay for dinners unless you have been awarded free meals by Leeds City Council.

Dinners for Nursery & Classes 11,12,13,14,15,16,17,18,19,20 & 21 are £1.60 per Day or £8.00 a week.

All children must have a change of clothes for PE eg jogging trousers, jumper and suitable footwear pumps, trainers for both indoor and outdoor PE, this includes children in Nursery.
