Late Picking up

We have an increasing number of children not being picked up on time at 3.20pm when school finishes. Children stay outside the front office until 3.30pm and then are taken into After School Club to sit and wait. There will be a charge of £5 for this service. If you think you might be late picking your child/children up please book them into After School Club for £3 before 1 O'clock.
